SUBJECT: Defense Human Resources Activity Fiscal Year 2025 Small Business Goals

Thank you for your dedication to supporting small businesses in achieving our objectives. Your efforts play a crucial role in bolstering the nation's economic strength by involving small businesses in our procurement processes. Small business plays a vital role in supporting Defense Human Resources Activity (DHRA) missions.

Small businesses make up more than 99% of all employer firms, are top contributors to innovation and technology, and are important to the nation's economic strength. These businesses are essential in maintaining our military's readiness, including by providing essential components, advanced technology, and exceptional services. They also strengthen our defense supply chains, especially in crises.

In Fiscal Year 2024, with your support, DHRA awarded over 30% of eligible small business spend to small business, exceeding the goal. Additionally, DHRA marked strong support in all of the small business subcategories:
